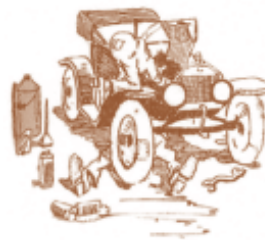
Model T Display & Yard Sale

Mark your calendars for September 21st arrival date, and touring on the 22nd, 23rd, 24th and leaving on the 25th.

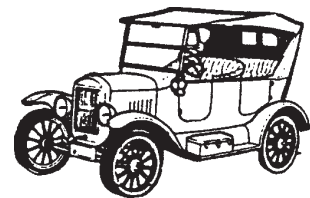
Cost for tour is \$140.00 Per Person, make your check out to REMTC and mail To:
